Dear Confreres,

Greetings from Don Bosco Provincial House, Guwahati!

The month of November opens with the Solemnity of All Saints, followed by the All Souls Day which commemorates the souls of the departed. These two liturgical celebrations draw attention to the mystery of life and death in the life of every disciple of Christ. In the feast of All Saints we celebrate the holiness of the church and the communion of saints, while in the All Souls, we recall our obligations to pray for the deceased, particularly those whom we have known, so that they may be made worthy of eternal life with God. Let us examine these two spiritual events at greater depth.

THE ALL SAINTS DAY

The Solemnity of All Saints, celebrated on November 1st, is one of the significant solemnities in the Catholic church in which we honour all the saints, known and unknown, who are deemed worthy to be with God in heaven. It is a day the church celebrates on earth the joy of the resurrection enjoyed by all those who have been glorified. The saints of the church reflect the holiness of the church, and we recall and celebrate with gratitude their example of holiness, in many instances, their heroic courage and witness to the faith, their exemplary life of charity and faithfulness to the gospel. The saints belong to all age groups and times, nationalities and cultures. But they are united in their outstanding life of fidelity to Christ and the gospel. Their example of faith, virtue and holiness are a legacy that the church presents to the faithful for imitation.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The origins of All Saints' Day may be traced to the early centuries of Christianity when Christians commemorated the martyrs who had died for their faith during the Roman persecutions. Due to the sheer number of martyrs and the kind of death they encountered, it became difficult to document all evidence needed about many of them. Popular devotions and local customs helped to foster the cult of many of the early saints who laid down their lives in martyrdom.

The observance of a feast to commemorate all the saints, especially to honour the many martyrs, arose in the church as a common feast. In the Roman church November 1 was adopted for this feast in the eighth century. Later in the ninth century, Pope Gregory IV extended this celebration to the entire Latin church.

SIGNIFICANCE AND TRADITIONS

As we are aware, the Solemnity of All Saints is a holy day of obligation, which requires that all the faithful to attend Mass. The gospel reading for the day recalls the Beatitudes, which is the kernel of the gospel, and living a life rooted in its precepts is the sure path to sanctity as lived and bequeathed to us by the saints.

The faithful are encouraged to reflect on the lives of the saints and to seek their intercession.

The central themes of All Saints' Day is the "communion of saints." This doctrine emphasizes the spiritual solidarity between the faithful on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven. The church continues to be the Body of Christ of which we are the members.

In the Credo we recall that the church is *One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic*. The church celebrates its unity and oneness in Christ as the mystical body and bride of Christ. She expresses her holiness through the lives of the saints and holy men and women, who offer heroic witness to the gospel. The catholicity of the church finds expression in her universality in space and time as the sacrament of salvation for all peoples. The church manifests its apostolic identity through tracing back to the apostolic tradition and as one sent by the Father and Christ on mission.

CALL TO HOLINESS

The Feast of All Saints reminds us of the great treasury of the church's holiness as manifested in the numerous saints from all times, places and circumstances. They are called the great 'Cloud of Witnesses' of the church and models of faith, hope, charity and other evangelical virtues. In honouring them the church not only acknowledges their witness, but also points out to all the faithful the sure path to holiness. Their lives manifest and encourage us too of how God's grace can transform our lives and encourage us to seek holiness. On this feast day we celebrate the lives of those who have gone before us tracing the path of sanctity, who serve as models of faith and virtue. By honouring all the saints in unison, the church acknowledges the diverse ways that lead to holiness and how God's grace and the intercession of the saints can transform all Christians to live the gospel and seek holiness.

DON BOSCO AND SALESIAN HOLINESS

It has been nearly 150 years since Don Bosco died, and in this brief period, the Salesian Family has over 115 Saints, Blesseds, Venerables, and Servants of God. These men and women come from all walks of life, but all are part of the Salesian way, Don Bosco's way, doing little things for God with great joy and simplicity.

The Salesian spirituality is a way of living community life and of becoming saints. Sanctity is not something we claim, but it is a gratuitous participation in God's holiness and is, therefore, a gift of grace. The Salesian Constitutions tells us that the Holy Spirit raised up St John Bosco in the church for the salvation of the youth. (C.1). So are all the Salesian saints:

they too are raised by God to the altars through the public acknowledgment of the church. They are all testimony to God's grace working in the lives of individuals who have responded to the call to holiness.

SALESIANS 'BE SAINTS'

We have frequently heard this expression, 'Salesians, be saints,' inviting and exhorting Salesians to seek holiness of life. This is not merely a slogan, but a call to respond to the call God extends to and instills in everyone. Our Constitutions Article 1 further states: "The church has acknowledged God's hand in this, especially by approving our Constitutions and by proclaiming our Founder a saint". Don Bosco entrusted our Society in a special way to Mary, whom he made its principal patroness, as well as to St Joseph and to St Francis de Sales, the zealous pastor and doctor of charity. We hold in veneration as special protectors St Dominic Savio, a sign of the wonders that grace can achieve in adolescents, and the other glorified members of our Family" (C. 9). By raising Don Bosco to the altars, the church not only acknowledges his sanctity, but presents to us his spirituality as a sure path towards our own holiness.

Each of the Salesian saints is a proof that Salesian spirituality and way of life are unmistakable paths to holiness. According to Art 25 of our Constitutions, the most precious gift that the Salesians can give to the youth is our holiness. Don Bosco's Oratory was like a lovely garden of sanctity of many flowers. In his biography of Dominic Savio, Don Bosco remarked that there were many other young boys in his Oratory who were of outstanding holiness like Savio.

Together with the Salesian saints who are raised to the altars, we also celebrate the witness of Salesian holiness lived out in exemplary way by many Salesians whom we have known. "Faith in the risen Christ sustains our hope and keeps alive our communion with our brothers who rest in Christ's peace. They have spent their lives in the Congregation, and some have suffered even to the point of martyrdom for love of the Lord" (C. 94).

In our communities let us foster devotion to the saints by commemorating their feasts and presenting their lives as examples to the young. We can create an environment of holiness through various devotions, promoting books and movies, displaying pictures and statues of saints that remind the young of these models of holiness they too can strive to imitate. During the Mass and Good Night talks let us briefly tell them about the saint of the day. Praying the Litany of the Saints, helping families and children to choose appropriate saints as their patron saints are also good practices we can foster.

ALL SOULS' DAY: A DAY OF REMEMBRANCE AND PRAYER

All Souls' Day, observed on November 2nd, comes immediately after the commemoration of the Saints. It is a day dedicated to remembering and praying for the souls of the faithful departed. The observance of All Souls' Day reflects the church's belief in the communion of saints and the importance of intercessory prayers for souls in purgatory.

The day affirms belief in purgatory, a state of purification for those who have died in God's grace but still need to be purified before entering heaven. The day also emphasises the power of intercessory prayer for the deceased, and the close relationship between the church Militant (the faithful on earth) and the church Penitent (the souls in purgatory) and the church Triumphant (the saints in heaven).

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The origins of All Souls' Day can be traced back to the early Christian practice of praying for the dead. The formal establishment of a specific day for this purpose is attributed to St. Odilo, the abbot of Cluny, in the 10th century. Soon the observance spread to the whole of the West.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ALL SOULS DAY

While All Saints' Day honours those who have attained heaven, All Souls' Day is dedicated to those who are still undergoing purification in purgatory. The feast marks the teaching of the church on the afterlife and the process of sanctification and the communion of the church on earth, heaven and those who are in purgatory.

The church teaches us that the prayers of the living can aid the souls in purgatory, bring them succour and help to attain the beatific vision of God in heaven. We offer Holy Masses for the Souls in purgatory. Families visit cemeteries and graves of loved ones, decorating them with flowers and candles and pray the Rosary and other prayers for the Souls of their dear departed ones. These practices underscore the belief in the resurrection and the hope of eternal life.

Lighted candles on the graves of their loved ones in cemeteries symbolises the light of Christ and the hope of eternal life. In some countries and cultures, the All Souls Day is also a time of family re-union when all the members of the family come together to remember their parents and other deceased members. This helps to foster unity and fellowship of the family through prayer and other devotions and sharing of family meals and time of togetherness.

All Souls' Day is much loved by our people especially as it is a profound expression of the Catholic faith in the afterlife, the efficacy of prayer, and the hope of resurrection. It is a day when people appreciate the opportunity the church offers to remember and pray for their dear departed, to reflect on the mysteries of life and death, and to reaffirm the belief in the communion of saints.

SALESIAN OBSERVANCE

Don Bosco's primary goal in all his pastoral and educative projects was the salvation of the young. This is so beautifully expressed in his motto: "Give me souls, take away the rest." "The 'da mihi animas" continues to inspire us. It is the distinguishing characteristic of our vocation and all our apostolic endeavours. Don Bosco used the Feast of the All Souls as a great opportunity for catechesis of the young on the mystery of life and death and

the hope of eternity. We too can continue this wonderful tradition of making use of the commemoration as a pedagogic moment.

There are many ways in which our communities and centres can promote the All Souls Day and observance of the whole month of November. We can encourage the young people and our parishioners to pray for the deceased in their families, visit the cemeteries, pray for the deceased Salesian Family members, teachers and past pupils they have known. We should also encourage praying of the Rosary for this intention and the frequent use of invocations such as “Eternal rest Grant unto them O Lord, may the souls of the departed through the mercy of God rest in Peace.”

NEWS AND EVENTS

INTER PROVINCE QUINQUENNIAL OF ING AND IND HELD AT DBPH

The Inter Provincial Junior Priests’ Meeting for the Guwahati (ING) and Dimapur (IND) Provinces took place at Don Bosco Provincial House, Guwahati, from October 10-13, 2024, with 45 young Salesian priests and brothers in attendance. The gathering provided a meaningful setting for spiritual reflection, practical insights, sharing and fellowship.



The meeting began with an Opening Prayer by Fr. Joseph Bara, SDB, followed by a welcome from Fr. Bivan Rodrigues Mukhim, Vice Provincial of Guwahati. Rev. Fr. K.P. Paul, SDB, gave the keynote address, inspiring renewed missionary commitment among the participants.

Morning prayer and the Eucharist, led by Fr. George Plathottam, Secretary of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences, set a reflective tone for the second day. Fr. Plathottam led sessions on “Communication, Synodality, and Ecclesiology of Pope Francis” and “Towards Full Presence: Pastoral Reflection on Social Media.” In the afternoon, Fr. Devasia Vazhayil, SDB, spoke on “Charism in Ministry,” and the day concluded with Eucharistic

Adoration and a sharing session where priests reflected on their experiences in ministry.

The third day began with Eucharist celebrated by Fr. Sebastian Kuricheal, Provincial of Guwahati, followed by sessions on the “Salesian Youth Movement” led by Fr. Bivan and a continuation of Fr. Vazhayil’s insights on charism. Another experience-sharing session fostered fraternity and support among the priests.

On the final day, Fr. Deli Kapani, Vice Provincial of Dimapur, celebrated the Eucharist, and Fr. Vazhayil led a closing session on balancing pastoral duties with personal growth. The gathering concluded in Mario Hall, with Fr. Sebastian Kuricheal encouraging the young priests toward selfless service. Fr. Gabriel Ngouning Jacob offered a vote of thanks, and the event concluded with a hymn to Don Bosco, symbolizing their renewed commitment to the Salesian mission.

PROVINCE COMMUNITY DAY 2024 CELEBRATED

On October 31, 2024, the Salesian Province of Mary Help of Christians, Guwahati, celebrated Province Community Day under the theme “Walking in the Footsteps of Don Bosco: A Call to Holiness” at Don Bosco Provincial House. The event commenced with arrivals and tea at 9:00 AM, followed by the inauguration at Mario Hall, led by MC Fr. Anmol Soreng, SDB.



The program began with a hymn to the Holy Spirit sung by the young Salesians, followed by the lighting of the lamp by Provincial Fr Sebastian Kuricheal, Fr Jose Varickassseril , Fr Marcus Lakra, Fr Abraham Kanattu, and Fr Thomas Anikuzhikattil. Fr Sebastian Ishorary, SDB, read from the Bible (John 15:12-17), after which Fr Francis Kalariparambil, SDB, led the

prayer. Fr Sebastian Kuricheal, SDB, the Provincial, delivered the welcome speech, setting a positive tone for the day.



The highlight of the day was the inspiring animation talk by Rev. Fr Jose Varickasseril, SDB, a professor at Sacred Heart Theological College, Shillong, on the theme of the day, “ Walking in the Footsteps of Don Bosco: A Call to Holiness”. Following a coffee break, the felicitation program commenced, hosted by Fr Pradeep Ekka, SDB, including an opening song by the brothers and a presentation by Fr Romanus Barwa, SDB. Fr Ethelbert Minj, SDB, shared insights as a Provincial Counsellor.

The day’s spiritual highlight was the Holy Eucharist celebrated at St. Joseph's Co-cathedral, with Fr Sebastian Kuricheal, SDB, as the main celebrant. Young Salesians led the mass singing, while Fr Vincent Xalxo, SDB, and Fr Paul Minj, SDB, contributed to the readings and prayers.

The celebration concluded with a cake-cutting ceremony and a fraternal meal at the Provincial House Refectory, fostering unity and camaraderie among participants, echoing the sentiment that living and working together is fundamental to the Salesian vocation (Constitutions no. 49).

FOUNDATION STONE LAID FOR DB BOYS’ HOSTEL, BHOOTEACHANG

The foundation stone for the Don Bosco Boys’ Hostel at Bhooteachang under Tangla Parish was blessed in a simple but solemn ceremony led by Rev. Fr. Sebastian Kuricheal, SDB, Provincial of the Salesians. The blessing took place in the presence of Rev. Fr. Jayaprakash, SDB, Economer, Rev. Fr. Jeremias Tirkey, SDB, Parish Priest of Tangla, Fr. Ethelbert Minj, SDB,



Provincial Councillor, and a gathering of Salesian priests, sisters, and students, who witnessed the historic moment.

Currently, the school hosts its male students in the main school building, utilizing an old vocational building as the refectory. The new boys' hostel will provide improved facilities for male students, offering them a dedicated space for residence and growth. The girls of the school are already accommodated in a hostel run by the Sisters of St. Ann's of Luzern.

TRAINING FOR GARO VILLAGE CATECHISTS HELD AT SATGAON

A three-day training for Garo village catechists from Diphu Diocese took place at Mary Help of Christians Church, Satgaon, West Karbi Anglong, Assam, from October 25-27, 2024. Inaugurated by Fr. Abraham Kanattu, Rector of Sojong, the program emphasized the example of St. Paul, urging catechists to imitate his dedication to prayer, gratitude, and service. Fr. Kanattu encouraged the catechists to see their mission as divinely chosen, citing Philippians 1:3-11 for inspiration.



Key sessions covered “Tenets of Faith,” “The Liturgical Year” by Fr. Charles Sangma, “Synodality” by Fr. Albert Thyrniang, and the “Pauline Methods of Preaching” by Fr. Justin Arul Chinnaparaj. Sr. Isabella S. Sangma later joined as a resource person. With 49 catechists from across the diocese participating, the program concluded with a valedictory ceremony. Four catechists—Subash Marak, Amar Marak, Probhat Marak, and Gabriel Sangma—were honored for over 25 years of service. Rt. Rev. Paul Mattekatt, Bishop of Diphu, and Fr. Thyrniang praised their commitment to strengthening faith in Northeast India. The event included prayers, Masses, and rosaries, fostering a deeply spiritual experience.

DBC, TURA HOSTS INDO-BANGLA CULTURAL YOUTH CAMP

Don Bosco College, Tura, inaugurated a seven-day Indo-Bangla Cultural Youth Camp on October 7, 2024, welcoming delegates from Bangladesh to celebrate cultural exchange. The event featured Chief Guest Shri Nikman Ch. Marak, Deputy Chief Executive of the Garo Hills Autonomous District Council, and Guest of Honour Mr. Mankin from Caritas Mymensingh, Bangladesh. The inaugural program included a prayer song by students and ceremonial lamp lighting, attended by Fr. Januarius S. Sangma, the Principal, Fr. Bivan Mukhim, Dr. Barbara S. Sangma, and a delegate from Bangladesh. Dr. Barbara S. Sangma delivered the opening speech, emphasizing the event's significance.





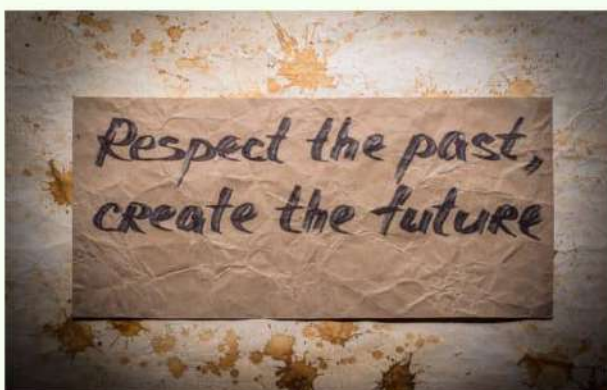
