Greetings from Don Bosco Provincial House, Guwahati!

## **THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY**

The month of October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. On October 7 we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The feast was introduced by Pope St. Pius V in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571.

In the Middle Ages the Rosary became a substitute for the Divine Office for the lay monks and devout lay persons who did not know how to read. Instead of the 150 psalms, they would pray 150 "Our Fathers" and "Hail Marys" counting them on a ring of beads known as the crown or "corona." Later the Rosary came to be divided into fifteen decades adding important episodes from the life of Christ into the joyful, sorrowful and glorious mysteries. In 2002, Pope John Paul II through his apostolic letter *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, added the luminous mysteries, also referred to as the Mysteries of Light

The Rosary is primarily a scriptural prayer. Pope Pius XII called the Rosary "a compendium of the entire Gospel". The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and recalls the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption. It is Mary's 'yes' that changed the world. At the Annunciation, Mary said 'yes' to the Angel Gabriel, who asked her to give birth to God's son, freely accepting God's will in her life.

Many other popes have contributed to promote devotion to the Rosary by their writings. Pope Leo XII encouraged devotion to the Blessed Mother by asking the faithful to constantly use the Rosary. He wrote a total of eleven encyclicals on the Rosary.

In the recent past, Pope Paul VI devoted the last section of his Apostolic Exhortation *Marialis Cultus* to the Angelus and the Rosary. In this document, he wrote that "the Rosary retains an unaltered value and intact freshness." John Paul II called the Rosary his favourite prayer, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart.

We know how much Don Bosco valued the Rosary and fostered devotion to the Rosary in his Oratory. In this month of October, let us, as true sons of Don Bosco, encourage the daily recitation of the Rosary in our communities and parishes. As is the custom in our communities, we can recite the Rosary not only in the formal settings of the chapels and churches, but also walking around or in procession, in front of a grotto or statue of Our Lady and in many other informal ways. On our journeys too praying the Rosary can become a good practice.

Let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a powerful means we, as well as those in our pastoral care, can use in order to draw closer to Jesus and Mary. By meditating on the mysteries of our salvation we can draw many blessings. Because Mary is our mother, devotion to her, particularly the prayer of the Holy Rosary, teaches us to be her authentic sons. As she was the Mother and Teacher of Don Bosco, she can teach us too to love truly, without limit, to be simple, to be happy, knowing that nothing can destroy our hope.

### **JUBILEE OF HOPE**

Pope Francis through the decree, “Spes non confundit” has announced the Jubilee Year 2025 with the theme of hope, a theme reflected in the opening words: Hope does not disappoint us.” The Jubilee will begin with the opening of the Holy Door of St Peter’s Basilica on Christmas Eve, 2024 and conclude on the Solemnity of Epiphany on January 6, 2026.

Pope Francis has emphasized that hope is the central message of this Jubilee Year. He reminds us that hope is not merely a passive wish but an active force that drives us to envision and work towards a better future. In his words, "Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God’s love"

A Jubilee Year is traditionally proclaimed by the Universal Church every 25 years. It is a particular year set aside to encourage the faithful to embark on pilgrimages, to repent of their sins and forgive the sins of others, and to renew a focus on the spiritual life. In the Hebrew tradition, as recorded in Leviticus, a Jubilee was celebrated every 50 years with the freeing of slaves and the forgiveness of debts. In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee, and since then the Church has designated each new Jubilee as a special year of grace and forgiveness, offering the faithful an opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence.

The Holy See has made a detailed calendar of events to be commemorated throughout the Jubilee Year. With its theme “Pilgrims of Hope,” we are called to embark on a journey of hope, a journey that resonates deeply in our hearts. Pope Francis has asked that “every effort be made to enable the

People of God to participate fully in the proclamation of hope in God's grace and in the signs that attest to their efficacy." In the letter of declaration of the jubilee, the Pope wrote: "Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future will bring."

Expressing his desire that the Jubilee might be "an opportunity for us to be renewed in hope, Pope Francis recalled that pilgrimage is "a fundamental event of every Jubilee," traditionally associated with the human quest for the meaning of life. He invited all the particular churches throughout the world to prepare priests and the faithful for Sacramental Confession, which should be readily available throughout the year.

The Holy Father prayed that during the Jubilee Year, "the light of Christian hope might illumine every man and woman, as a message of God's love addressed to all," and that "the Church might bear faithful witness to this message in every part of the world." He also noted the desire for peace in a world increasingly marked by violence and conflict, and the loss of a desire to have children, with many countries facing a "demographic winter." He called for a social covenant to support and foster hope.

The Pope appealed especially for prisoners, recalling the tradition of offering amnesty or pardon during Jubilees, and said he hopes to personally open a Holy Door in a prison, "as a sign inviting prisoners to look to the future with hope and a renewed sense of confidence." And he called for prisoners to be treated in accord with their rights and dignity, while once again pleading for the abolition of the death penalty.

The Pope also appealed to offer hope to the sick, the young and to the elderly – especially grandparents, to migrants and to the poor. The Holy Father recalled that the fruits of the earth are intended for all, and encouraged everyone to come to the assistance of the poor. In particular, he called on richer nations to forgive the debts of countries that will never be able to repay them.

Recalling that 2025 is the 1700th anniversary of the First Ecumenical Council, Pope Francis urged expressions of synodality, and renewed efforts to further Christian unity.

Pope Francis insisted that Christian hope, rooted in Christ's death and resurrection for each human person, points to our final destiny, eternal happiness with God in heaven. We are saved by God's mercy, seen especially in the gift of indulgences: While Confession washes away our sins, indulgences – including the Jubilee Indulgence – remove the effects of sins forgiven in the Sacrament.

*Spes non confundit* ends with Pope Francis exclaiming, “Let us even now be drawn to this hope!” He calls on Christians to live a life in keeping with their faith, as a witness and an invitation to all to “hope in the Lord.” “May the power of hope fill our days,” the Pope says, “as we await with confidence the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and glory, now and forever.”

As we embark on this Jubilee journey, let us remember that hope is not a passive waiting but an active striving. It is the courage to dream of a better future and the determination to work towards it. Let us be inspired by the words of Pope Francis, who reminds us that “hope is bold; it can look beyond personal convenience, the petty securities and compensations which limit our horizon, and it can open us up to grand ideals that make life more beautiful and worthwhile.”

In conclusion, let us embrace this Jubilee of Hope with open hearts and minds. Let us be pilgrims of hope, carrying the light of Christ into every corner of our world. May this Jubilee inspire us to live with greater compassion, to act with greater justice, and to love with greater generosity. Let us take this Jubilee Year as an opportunity to renew our faith, to deepen our hope, and to act with greater compassion and justice. May we all be inspired to live out the Gospel message in our daily lives and to be true bearers of hope in a world that so desperately needs it.

As we look around the world today, we see a landscape marked by conflict, and the urgent crisis of climate change. These challenges can often seem insurmountable, casting shadows of doubt and despair. Yet, it is precisely in these moments of darkness that the light of hope shines the brightest. Pope Francis so beautifully expressed: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision."

### **SALESIANS AND THE JUBILEE**

For Don Bosco, the wish of the Pope was a command. By actively participating in the jubilee year and celebrating it with our people, we join the universal and local churches to express our unity. The Jubilee Year is a time for us Salesians to rediscover the power of hope and to proclaim it boldly and to find in this historic moment an opportunity for conversion and reconciliation. It is a time of grace for us to seek forgiveness, to renew our faith, and to embrace the sacrament of penance. Don Bosco was an ardent apostle of the sacrament of Confession. He prepared the young people to encounter God and prepare them for heaven. He accompanied the young people of his Oratory on pilgrimages and visits to churches.

For us Salesians it is important to accompany the young in their journey of faith through effective catechesis, preparing them for the fruitful reception of the sacraments. Let us make our communities privileged settings for their holistic growth. Our focus on daily prayer, sacraments, word of God, spiritual direction and other forms of accompaniment in their journey of faith will surely bear much fruit. Our apostolic fruitfulness will find expression in good vocations, faithful Christian life and evangelisation. In the years to come they also contribute to the formation of good Christian families.

### NEWS AND EVENTS

#### **RECTORS' AND LEADERS' ANIMATION AND MEETING HELD AT PROVINCIAL HOUSE, GUWAHATI**

The Rectors' and Leaders' Animation and Meeting of the Salesian Province of Mary Help of Christians, Guwahati, took place on 13 September 2024, with the participation of Rectors and Leaders from various communities of the province. The meeting, held to discuss key areas of Salesian ministry, was marked by insightful sessions, discussions, and prayers.

The day commenced with an opening prayer led by Fr. Karottupuram



Augustine SDB, setting a spiritual tone for the gathering. This was followed by a welcome address from the Provincial, Fr. Sebastian Kuricheal SDB, who welcomed the attendees and highlighted the importance of the role of Rector in

animation of the Salesian community.

The first session, titled “The Ministry of the Salesian Rector,” was led by Fr. M. P. Thomas SDB, former Provincial of Dimapur and a well-respected veteran Salesian. His presentation delved into the role of the Rector in animating and fostering a vibrant Salesian community, emphasizing leadership role, pastoral care, and spiritual guidance.

Fr. M. P. Thomas also moderated the second session on “Community Life and Challenges,” which sparked lively group discussions. The Rectors were divided in smaller groups according to the region to discuss and reflect on the challenges they face in their communities, particularly in ensuring harmony and cooperation. Presentations from these discussions focused on



a shared "Vision for the Province," providing valuable insights into the future direction of the Province.

Fr. Jayaprakash Anthonimuthu SDB, the Province Economist, spoke on "Financial Management and Sustainability". He stressed the need for strategic planning and resource management to ensure the long-term financial health of the Province.



Fr. Amit Chama Lakra, the Province Delegate for Missionary Animation (PDMA), then addressed on the theme of Evangelisation and catechesis, exploring its vital role in the spread of the Gospel and in deepening the faith of young people and the people of God. His session laid the groundwork for the next presentation on "Youth Ministry and Education" by Fr. Bivan Rodrigues Mukhim SDB, Vice Provincial, who highlighted the important role the Rectors and other confreres play in Youth Ministry which the core mission of Salesians and exhort all cooperate in reviving the Salesian Youth Movement in the province, which as of now is dormant. He also shared with them the vision and roadmap of the Province in reference to SYM.

The final session of the day, "Province Updates and Reports," was animated by Fr. Sebastian Kuricheal SDB, Provincial. He shared key updates on the Province's activities and initiatives, urging the Rectors to continue serving and leading their communities with dedication and self-sacrifice.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Fr. Pojit Marak, acknowledging the efforts of all those who contributed to the success of the event. The day ended with an Adoration Service by Fr. Abhilash Vadakkekara, followed by a Goodnight Talk from Fr. Sebastian Kuricheal, offering words of encouragement and inspiration to the Rectors.

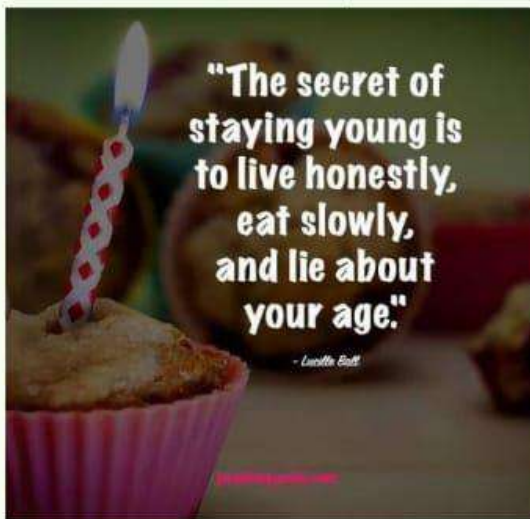

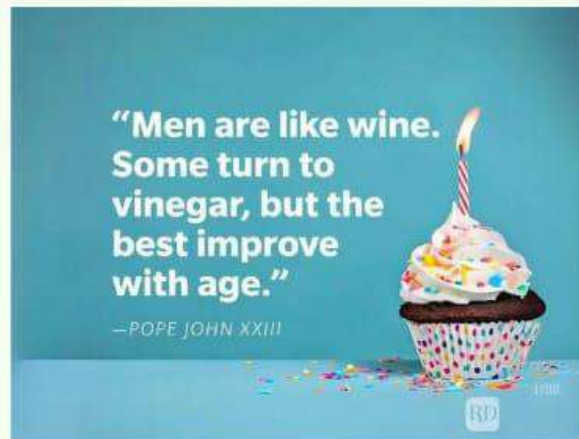
