Dear Confreres,

Prayerful greetings for the New Year 2025.

The year 2025 is very important for us in many ways- in the Church we celebrate the Jubilee of Hope. For us Salesians, it is also a very special year as we celebrate the 29th General Chapter (GC29) on the theme: "Passionate for Jesus Christ, Dedicated to the Young - For a faithful and prophetic lived experience of our Salesian vocation." The GC29 will begin on February 16, 2025, and conclude on April 12, 2025. Let us pray for a fruitful General Chapter.

MISSION AT THE HEART OF THE CHURCH AND THE CONGREGATION

The year is also special for us as it marks the 150th anniversary of the first Salesian missionary expedition sent by Don Bosco. Since then hundreds of missionaries have gone out to many parts of the world, including our own region of Northeast India more than a century ago. It is indeed a historic moment in the life of our Congregation. Another important event is the second Asian Mission Congress organized by the FABC scheduled to be held in Penang, Malaysia, in November 2025. The Synod on Synodality, the Jubilee of Hope, the celebration of the 150th anniversary of the first Salesian missionary expedition and the Asian Mission Congress are all occasions for us to renew our missionary vocation and re-dedicate ourselves to the proclamation of Christ and his Gospel among our people. We are also preparing for the great jubilee of 2033- two thousand years of the Lord's passion, death and resurrection, which we celebrate in our Eucharist daily and more solemnly on Sundays. The Church in Northeast India held its Pastoral Conference during which we studied and reflected on the document *Ecclesia in Asia* given by Pope John Paul II twenty-five years ago following the Asian Synod of Bishops.

JUBILEE OF HOPE

Though I have already written about the Jubilee Year we celebrate in 2025, once again, I wish to draw your attention to this important milestone in the life of the Church. The Jubilee Year began with the opening of the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve, 2024. Pope Francis announcing the Jubilee had said: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. He had asked the Church and the faithful to find suitable ways for the Holy Year to be planned and celebrated with deep faith, lively hope and active charity. I am sure you will follow the calendar of events the Church has planned for the Jubilee throughout the year. Let us make every effort to celebrate the Jubilee in suitable ways in our own centres so that we and the people we

serve receive the fruits of this season of grace. As Pope Francis reminded us, the Jubilee is an expression of the shared journey that the Church is called to make, in order to be ever more fully a sign and instrument of unity in harmonious diversity. It is a universal call to responsible participation by enhancing the charisms and ministries that the Holy Spirit bestows on us for the building up of the one Church. The Jubilee will end in the particular Churches throughout the world on 28 December 2025, with the Holy Doors of St John Lateran, St Mary Major, and St Paul's Outside the Walls being closed on that same date. And finally, the Jubilee Year will draw to a close in Rome on the Solemnity of Epiphany, 6 January 2026. Let the various events being held throughout the year to mark the Jubilee of Hope bring us showers of blessings from the Lord.

JUBILEE IN THE BIBLE

The tradition of Jubilee takes us back to the book of Leviticus Chapter 25:8-13, where we read, "You shall count seven weeks of years, seven times seven years, so that the time of the seven weeks of years shall be to you forty-nine years. Then you shall sound abroad the loud trumpet on the tenth day of the seventh month; on the Day of Atonement; you shall send abroad the trumpet throughout all your land. And you shall hallow the fiftieth year and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants; it shall be a jubilee for you, when each of you shall return to his property, and each of you shall return to his family. You shall keep the fiftieth year as a jubilee; in it you shall neither sow, nor reap what grows of itself, nor gather the grapes from the undressed vines. For it is a jubilee; it shall be holy to you; you shall eat what it yields out of the field. In this year of jubilee each of you shall return to his property". The jubilee was broadcast by blowing a horn. The ram's horn trumpet was called *yobel*. And through the Greek version, of the Old Testament this came into the Latin language as *Jubila-eum*: jubilee.

JUBILEE IN THE CHURCH

The Jubilee has always been an event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church. Ever since 1300, when Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Holy Year – initially celebrated every hundred years, then, following its biblical precedent, every fifty years, and finally every twenty-five years – God's holy and faithful people has experienced this celebration as a special gift of grace, characterized by the forgiveness of sins and in particular by the indulgence, which is a full expression of the mercy of God.

The faithful, frequently at the conclusion of a lengthy pilgrimage, draw from the spiritual treasury of the Church by passing through the Holy Door and venerating the relics of the Apostles Peter and Paul preserved in the Roman basilicas. Throughout the centuries millions of pilgrims have journeyed to these sacred places, bearing living witness to the faith professed in every age.

CONVERSION AND MERCY

A word that is closely connected to the jubilee is the word ‘*Indulgence*’. Today many people do not understand the word ‘*indulgence*’, but this word and the word ‘*Mercy*’ were almost synonyms in the middle ages and from the beginning jubilees were based on the Jubilee Indulgence. The Jubilee Indulgence was a remission or forgiveness of sins, as Pope Boniface VIII stated. The people of Rome wanted the Jubilee and ever since then, the Jubilee Year has been observed as a part of the observations of the institutional Church. Let us keep in mind the spiritual dimension of the Jubilee, which is a call for conversion, a time of reconciliation and renewal.

Pope Francis wrote in his letter announcing the Jubilee: “Now, as the first twenty-five years of the new century draw to a close, we are called to enter into a season of preparation that can enable the Christian people to experience the Holy Year in all its pastoral richness. A significant step on this journey was already taken with the celebration of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, which allowed us to appreciate anew all the power and tenderness of the Father’s merciful love, in order to become, in our turn, its witnesses.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE

The motto of the Jubilee, *Pilgrims of Hope* is a call to renew our hope in the face of devastations and wars, the tragic effects of the pandemic that affected the whole world, and the consequences of climate change and migration, poverty and hardships that people face everywhere. As Pope Francis urged, we must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire.

The jubilee must help us to be more caring and compassionate especially to people who live in great poverty and hardship, those who lack human dignity or are in different ways exploited. The Pope invited everyone to hear the voices of the poor and to ensure they too have access to the fruits of the earth. In planning various events of the Jubilee celebrations, our communities should pay particular attention to the poor and vulnerable people who live in our midst, in our neighbourhoods.

A TIME FOR PRAYER AND THANKSGIVING

The Jubilee would be incomplete without devoting our attention to a more intense period of prayer. Prayer is an expression of our desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and to adore him. Prayer is a moment to thank God for the many gifts of his love for us and to praise his work in creation. From deep and intense prayer comes charity and sense of solidarity, and the stimulus for all our apostolic endeavours. *Pilgrims of Hope* are people on a journey, and we too join the Pilgrim Church on that

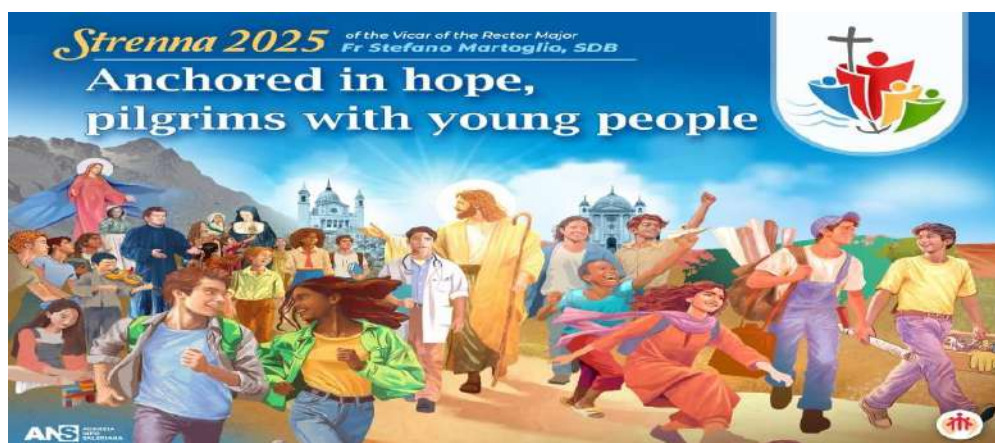
journey. It is a journey in the light of God, tracing our footsteps and turning our gaze solely towards God and his Kingdom.

As Salesians we are called to discover the joy and beauty of our vocation and constantly seek holiness of life as we journey on. When we intensely desire for holiness through a life rooted in prayer and fervent apostolic activity, we will certainly experience the gift of a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the love of the Father and Jesus, his Son. Following the example of Don Bosco, let us also turn to our Blessed Mother, Mary Help of Christians, who is our companion on this journey of hope, this pilgrimage to God. Mary continues in the Church the apostolic mission of bringing Jesus to the world.

CHRIST IS OUR HOPE

Hope is one of the three theological virtues along with faith and love. But it is perhaps more difficult to speak about hope than the other two virtues because hope is more intangible and appear to be distant. But true hope is rooted in Christ, in fact Christ himself is our hope. It is not a mere idea or a wish. So many people today in our world have lost hope. It is part of our human fragility coming from our fallen human nature. And this fallen human nature is reflected in our politics and governance, social interactions and family relationships. We also come across people who have completely lost hope, who have given up their faith in God and succumb to evils like alcohol, drugs or even the will to live. There is a trust deficit in human relationships and behaviour that is present in our world. We can help build hope when we our own lives are deeply centred on God.

Psalm 20:7 tells us: “Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the LORD our God” Let us not place our trust in human strengths and abilities, in wealth or material sureties. Hope, to be genuine, must be deeply rooted in God, in Christ. St. Augustine tells us that everybody loves charity. Everybody believes in faith, and everybody hopes; the difference lies in what constitutes the object of our faith, hope and charity. And obviously for Christians Christ is our Hope. Christ is our Hope because he opens the gates of Eternal Life. Our journey is towards that goal. But that doesn't mean that we neglect our responsibilities or earthly existence and concerns that affect our everyday life. Our life here on earth should be lived to the full, with our gaze turned towards heaven; our heart filled with the hope of the glory that is to come.

JOINT RETREAT FOR SALESIANS HELD AT SILOAM

The Joint Retreat for the Salesians of the Provinces of Shillong, Dimapur, and Guwahati was held from December 8–14, 2024, at Siloam, Umiam. Led by Rev. Fr. James Mathew of the Kolkata Province, the retreat brought together 48 retreatants (46 priests and 2 brothers) for a spiritually enriching experience of prayer, reflection, and renewal.



Participants praised the Scripture based retreat in the serene environment of Siloam, which provided an ideal space for spiritual growth and rejuvenation.

NEW PROVINCIALS ORIENTATION AND TRAINING COURSE IN ROME

The program, held at Sacro Cuore, the Salesian Generalate in Rome, ran from December 9 to 21.



The course offered invaluable guidance on the essential aspects of animation and governance, emphasizing leadership within the Salesian mission. Fr. Pier Fausto Frisoli and Fr. Guido Garino shared key insights into the legal dimensions of our roles, while Fr. Stefano Martoglio, Vicar of the Rector Major, and various Sector Councillors provided updates on the Congregation's priorities and projects.

Participants gained a deeper understanding of the dynamics of Salesian life across diverse contexts and engaged in meaningful daily dialogues with the Vicar or Councillors. These sessions fostered open discussions on challenges, opportunities, and strategies for effective governance. Visits to operational bodies such as the Salesian Pontifical University and the Secretariat for the Salesian Family offered practical insights into the global mission of the Congregation.

The programme was enriched by moments of prayer and novena in preparation for Christmas, which deepened the fraternity and Salesian spirit among all participants. This comprehensive training has equipped us with renewed knowledge, inspiration, and zeal to serve our mission effectively.



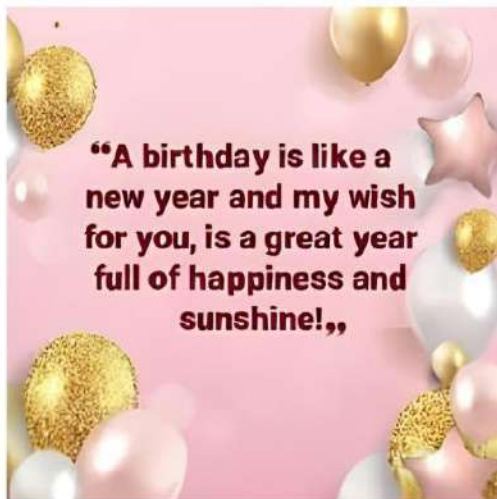

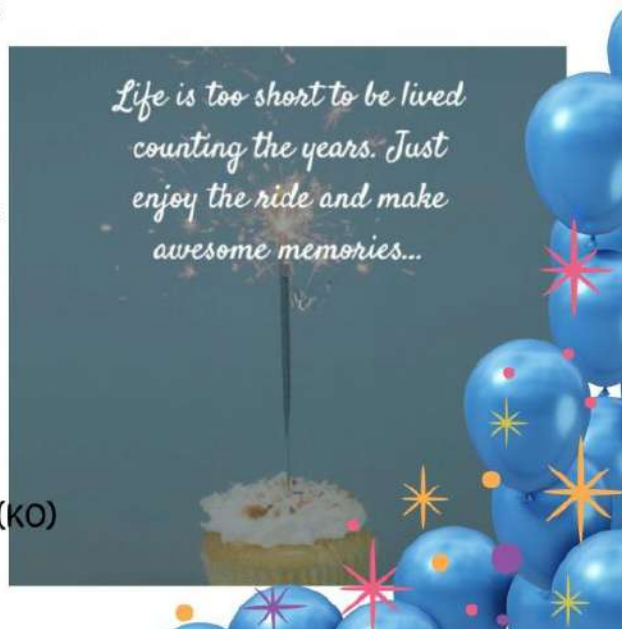
