Greetings from Valdocco, Turin!

As we begin this significant period in the life of our Congregation with the commencement of the 29th General Chapter in Turin, I write to share with you the profound inspiration and challenging call that emerges from the opening address of Fr Stefano Martoglio, Vicar of the Rector Major.

The theme guiding our reflection and renewal is beautiful and demanding: "Passionate about Jesus Christ, dedicated to young people." This theme calls us to faithfully and prophetically live our Salesian vocation, particularly in our context in Northeast India.

THE HEART OF OUR IDENTITY

Fr Stefano reminded us of Don Bosco's words at the first General Chapter: "Our Divine Saviour tells us in the Gospel that where two or three are gathered in His name, He will be there among them. Our sessions have no other purpose than God's greater glory and the salvation of souls." These words resonate deeply with us today as we serve in various presences in our region.

The centrality and primacy of God must be evident in all our works. From this foundation, we, together with the members of the Salesian family, the laity, and the young people themselves, draw our energy and motivation for dedication to the mission among the young. This is particularly relevant in our Province, where we work alongside members of the Salesian Family, many dedicated lay collaborators, Past Pupils and young leaders in our schools, parishes, and youth centres.

THREE CORE AREAS FOR OUR RENEWAL

The General Chapter presents three core areas that demand our attention and response. The first concern is the animation and care of the true life of each Salesian. We are called to be consecrated to Jesus, to fix our gaze on him, safeguarding this relationship in our daily lives. This spiritual foundation becomes particularly crucial in our context, where we are called to be signs of hope among youth who are economically disadvantaged. Our Salesian vocation must be lived in openness and remain responsive to the needs of the poor, making us more human and attentive to everyone we serve.

The second core area is build on the reflections of GC28, focusing on how Salesians, the Salesian Family, and lay people work together 'with' and 'for' young people. While being faithful to the charism of Don Bosco, we must develop new models of presence and fresh expressions of the Salesian charism, particularly as we navigate the challenges of our times. The developments in communication technology, digital culture, Artificial Intelligence demand of us creative ways of expressing this beautiful charism for the total well-being of the young. We are also called to commit ourselves to an integral ecology in our pastoral and educational settings.

The third area calls for a courageous review of the Congregation's governance at all levels. This invites us to evaluate whether our current structures adequately serve our mission and calls for concrete action and forward-looking reflections. In our Province, this means examining how we can better organise our resources and structures to serve the young effectively, ensuring that our institutional frameworks truly support our mission rather than hinder it.

THE CHALLENGE BEFORE US

Dear confreres, as Fr Stefano reminded us, many positive aspects exist in our communities and works. However, this cannot serve as a 'consolation' when we hear the cry of the world, especially in our own specific contexts where young people face numerous challenges- unemployment, addiction, loss of cultural identity, and various forms of poverty.

The words of the Gospel, "Jesus called those he wanted to be with him and sent them out to preach" (Mk 3:14-15), remind us that we are chosen and sent. Our communities in the Province, though made up of ordinary people with strengths and weaknesses, are called to be prophetic signs in our region. Several voices in the Congregation, including many from our Province, ask us to address the reality of consecrated life and our way of living in the Lord with and for young people. There is a clear desire for greater authenticity in our mission.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

As we face these challenges, we are not alone. Our Mother, Mary Help of Christians, continues to guide us, just as she guided Don Bosco. The Chapter members are meeting in Turin, the very place of Don Bosco's Oratory, his field of action, where every brick breath with the presence of his beloved Madonna. As our own Province is dedicated to Mary Help of Christians, let us turn to her intercession in all our missionary enterprises. Her words at Cana, "Do whatever he tells you," become our mandate as we serve the young people of Northeast India. This moment calls us to envision boldly the future of our Salesian presence in the region, particularly as we face emerging challenges and opportunities.

Looking ahead, we must focus on several key priorities. First, we must strengthen our digital presence and capabilities, ensuring our educational and pastoral approaches remain relevant to today's youth. The rapid technological changes in our region demand that we adapt while maintaining the core of our Salesian charism. Second, we must deepen our commitment to ecological awareness and action, which is particularly relevant in our context, where environmental challenges directly affect the communities we serve.

Our formation programme, both initial and ongoing, needs to be re-imagined to prepare Salesians who can respond effectively to these and many emerging contemporary challenges. They include developing expertise in new areas such as digital ministry, ecological education, and mental health support for young people. Additionally, we must explore innovative ways to make our institutions more financially sustainable while ensuring they remain accessible to the poorest youth.

I encourage each community to be proactive in this journey of renewal. Take time to study and reflect on the GC29 documents as they emerge. Evaluate your local structures and practices in light of the three core areas. Strengthen your collaboration with the Salesian Family and lay partners. Above all, focus on authentic spiritual renewal and community life, for these are the foundations of all our future endeavours.

Let us draw inspiration from Don Bosco's words to Fr Giulio Barberis: "You will complete the work that I begin; I shall sketch it, you will colour it... I am now sketching a rough copy of the Congregation. I shall leave it to those coming after me to perfect it." This prophetic statement takes on new meaning in our current context. As we carry forward this legacy in our Province, we are called to be faithful to our tradition and be creative in responding to new challenges. May we remain steadfast in our commitment to the Lord and never disappoint the young people entrusted to our care, especially those most in need in our region! May the General Chapter be a moment of renewal and new resolve in our mission.

LENT 2025

We begin the holy season of Lent by celebrating Ash Wednesday on 5 March 2025. Lent is a season of grace during which we can break free from every form of bondage. It is a concrete, not abstract, journey that requires us to desire change and actively open our eyes to reality.

During this season, we need to confront modern forms of slavery - from environmental degradation to social indifference. Despite humanity's technological and cultural advances, we still "grope about in the darkness of inequality and conflict." The "deficit of hope" that parallels the Israelites' nostalgia for slavery can prevent people from moving forward toward true freedom.

It is a season of conversion, and we are called to struggle against internal and external obstacles to freedom. We must be aware of the "idols we set up for ourselves," such as the desire for power, money, or dominance over others. These idols can be more dangerous than external oppression because they paralyse spiritual growth and create conflict rather than encounter.

At the core of the message of Pope Francis for Lent is the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, which serves as a meaningful story providing insight into what is needed for true happiness and eternal life. The message uses this parable to explore the contrast between the unnamed rich man, defined only by his wealth and ostentatious lifestyle, and Lazarus, the poor man whose name signifies "God helps." While Lazarus lies suffering at the rich man's gate, he remains invisible to the wealthy man whose attachment to riches has blinded him. The message elaborates on the first key teaching that other persons are gifts deserving gratitude and recognition of their value. Lazarus, though poor and suffering, represents a summons to conversion and change. Lent is a favourable season for opening our hearts and doors to those in need and recognising in them the face of Christ. The word of God helps us open our eyes to welcome and love life, especially when it is weak and vulnerable.

In examining the rich man's character, the message reveals how sin blinds us through a progression of corruption: love of money, vanity, and pride. The rich man's extravagant clothing and daily feasting display his ostentatious wealth and attachment to superficial appearances. Citing the Apostle Paul, the message warns that love of money is "the root of all evils," capable of dominating us and becoming a tyrannical idol that leaves no room for love and hinders peace.

The message further explores how the rich man's moral degradation culminates in pride-dressing like a king and acting like a god while forgetting his mortality. This corruption by wealth creates blindness, where nothing exists beyond one's ego, rendering those suffering around us invisible. The Gospel emphasises the condemnation of money's hold: "You cannot be the slave both of God and of money."

A third key theme presents the Word of God as a gift that the rich man failed to heed. The message connects this to the Ash Wednesday liturgy, reminding us of our mortality with the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." In the afterlife, the rich man recognises Lazarus and asks for relief, wanting what he could have provided but never did. His fundamental problem was his failure to listen to God's word, which closed his heart to God and his neighbour.

The ashes we receive at the beginning of Lent hold deep spiritual and symbolic significance in the Christian tradition, particularly as we begin the holy season of Lent. These ashes remind us of our mortality and finite nature, echoing God's words to Adam in Genesis 3:19: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." This recognition of our mortality helps foster humility and reflection on life's ultimate meaning. In biblical times, people would sit in ashes and sprinkle them on their heads as a sign of repentance. The ashes we receive today symbolise our sorrow for sin and desire for renewal. This connects to the traditional words spoken while imposing ashes: "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

The cross-shaped mark made with ashes on the forehead identifies us as followers of Christ as we begin this penitential season. It is a visible sign of our commitment to interior transformation. The ashes signal the beginning of Lent, the forty days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They remind us to turn away from sin and towards God - the essence of conversion. This ties to Jesus' time of fasting and prayer in the desert.

These ashes serve as both a humbling reminder of our limitations and a hopeful sign of transformation through God's grace. They help us enter the Lenten season with the right spiritual disposition of repentance and renewal. Let us enter this holy season with due preparation and a desire to renew our lives and the lives of our communities. Let us examine closely our roles in building community life. Despite various challenges we face every day, we have remained and worked together, ensuring the growth of our charism. Let us welcome the season of Lent as a God-given opportunity, a time of grace for personnel and community renewal. Let us also form our people in their faith through a deeper and more intense catechesis so that they too can discover Lent to be a time of conversion, grace and renewal.
