Dear Confreres,

Greetings from Turin where we are privileged to be together with so many Salesians from across the world- so diverse in our nationalities, and cultural backgrounds, but all of us living together in fraternity and sharing the one charism and spirit of Don Bosco. We are at the very cradle of the Salesian spirituality where Don Bosco's charism flowered. It is here that he was called to live his vocation and his predilection for the poorest of the young people of his day. It was here that he was able to bear witness to his passion for Christ which made him give himself totally and unreservedly for the service of the youth, and his dream to found the Salesian Congregation; and it was from here that Don Bosco's charism eventually spread to the whole world. We thank God for the precious legacy that we have all received. In a sense, those of us who are at the General Chapter are breathing that air of Salesian charismatic and spiritual heritage that grew and flourished and found wings from this hallowed place.

As you are well aware, the 29th General Chapter represents a crucial moment of reflection, discernment, and renewal for the whole Congregation. The theme, "Passionate about Jesus Christ, dedicated to young people- Conversion and transformation" is an invitation for each one of us, Salesians, to undertake a profound examination of our identity and mission in the present context characterised by rapid social, pastoral, cultural and technological changes. The Chapter is not merely about some juridical matters or structural changes in the governance of the Congregation or the roles of authority. While these are important for a world-wide Congregation like ours, the primary focus of the GC 29 is to deepen our understanding of our charismatic identity in the church and the world and more radical and authentic following of Christ who called us.

In that sense, the fruitfulness of GC29 will be determined by the renewal of the vocation and mission of every Salesian, irrespective of age, competence or the particular service we carry out in living out our vocation. For those of us in the GC29, it is a moment of realisation of the richness and diversity of Don Bosco's charism lived out in such diverse contexts and circumstances, amidst many challenges and opportunities. Listening to the testimonies of courage and commitment from Salesians living in situations which are far more challenging than ours instil in us a greater sense of solidarity with Salesian confreres all over the world and know that we are one Family.

The GC 29 will come to a close within a few days from now, but we are at the beginning of a six-year journey to live out the reflections that emerge from this important event. The new Rector Major and his Council and the Provincials and their Councils along with the other members of the GC29 have particular responsibility to animate the confreres and communities in ensuring that the spirit of GC 29 find living expression in the way we live and exercise our Salesian charism. As we reflect on the Paschal mystery

and as we come close to the celebration of Easter, let us turn to the Risen Lord, and the Holy Spirit, who calls us to live our vocation and charismatic identity with greater commitment and pastoral zeal.

Don Bosco was canonised on an Easter Sunday. It has such a significance for us and the Salesian charism. It is an invitation to recognise our charismatic identity in the heart of the mystery of the Lord's resurrection. The Risen Lord calls us to a daily pledge of fidelity and renewal, to live our vocation with radical commitment. Though our contexts may vary and the way we serve the young people differ from country to country or community to community, the source of energy and passion for our mission flow from the Risen Lord, who promised to be with us till the end of times.

The GC 29 theme is an invitation for the whole Congregation to discover in the light of the present-day challenges and the world-wide renewal called for by the Synod on Synodality to examine and find new ways to give expression to our mission among young people, especially those who are the poorest and most marginalised. This demands that we be courageous and creative, remaining ever faithful to the charism of Don Bosco. We also have the responsibility to foster the Salesian spirit and charism among the other members of the Salesian Family and all those who are entrusted to our pastoral care.

The GC29 examined at depth three core areas. The first area is the animation and care of the real life of each Salesian: this core area focuses on the spiritual and vocational renewal of every Salesian and every local community. It explores how to nurture a deep inner life, strengthen consecrated identity and authentically live the evangelical counsels in the contemporary context.

The second concerns the Salesians, Salesian Family and lay people “with” and “for” young people. This topic deals with the challenge of the shared mission by examining how Salesians, Salesian Family members and lay people can collaborate more effectively in the education and evangelisation of the young. It reflects on joint formation, on shared responsibility and on new forms of Salesian presence.

The third is the review and renewal of the Congregation's governing structures: this core area considers the effectiveness of the current governing structures and proposes ways to make them more responsive to the needs of the Salesian mission in today's world. It includes reflections on leadership, resource management and adapting structures to local contexts.

The GC29 is also taking place immediately after the end of the worldwide event of the Synod on Synodality in the Church initiated by Pope Francis, which focuses on the themes of Communion, Mission and Participation. The Synod theme, the methodology of Conversation in the Spirit, the importance of attending to diversity and responding to cultural contexts, find resonance also in the GC29. While we thank the Lord for the great legacy of Don Bosco bequeathed to us and lived out in such diversity of contexts and situations, like our Founder, we are challenged to be open to the Spirit in living out the charism of Don Bosco in favour of the young in ways that are relevant to differing cultural and ecclesial contexts.

It is a challenge for all of us to journey with the Church on the Synodal path, and follow the footsteps of Don Bosco, who found new and ever creative ways of reaching out to the youth of his times, of building networks of collaboration and communion. Our times pose challenges for young people impacted by the digital technology, and new economic opportunities on the one hand, and growing search for identity, desire for better education, employment, financial security and affirmation of their dignity and rights, on the other.

We respond to these challenges by joining hands with the other members of the Salesian Family, the vast army of lay collaborators who share with us the charism of Don Bosco, and the whole Church and society. In this journeying together we have to become agents of change and creativity, becoming educators and pastors who can lead with humility and in a spirit of dialogue. Don Bosco, “the dreamer”, would expect of us to dream new dreams that can find ever new ways of giving expression to the Salesian charism in the ever-changing contexts of the world today.

We do not work as isolated individuals but as educative pastoral communities. The General Chapter has focused much attention on the need for collaboration and team spirit, of the need for a constant commitment to inculturation and contextualisation of the Salesian charism, in order to be the kind of Salesians and the kind of educative and pastoral community that young people today desire and deserve. The rich inputs that came from the Salesian Provinces and the Provincial Chapters have expressed both a high level of consensus on the issues and prophetic demands for the future of the Congregation. Let us give thanks for the richness and complexity of the Congregation, which challenge us to be creative and faithful to Don Bosco’s charism in the contemporary world.

The dream Don Bosco had when he was nine years old, continues to offer a powerful stimulus for transformation and reconciliation. It rekindles in us zeal for the mission and the will to live it with the attitudes of gospel gentleness and charismatic vigour that the Risen Lord gives us. The Salesian mission is based on the example of Jesus, who tells us in the Gospel, “Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me” (Mt 18:5). It is a constant reminder to us that every child, every young person is precious, and an “image” of Christ himself.

With courage, prophetic spirit and deep gratitude, we are called to live three fundamental dimensions of our vocation: the care of our own call and that of others, the courage to walk together– Salesians, lay people, members of the Salesian Family – with young people and the updating of our service of authority. These dimensions are concretely manifested in the care of creation, in attention to the digital world particularly frequented by children and young people, in making ourselves close to others through qualified personal accompaniment, and in the service of authority according to the model of Christ the Good Shepherd, in the footsteps of Don Bosco.

The Chapter members have been imbued by the Salesian spirituality at Valdocco, where we have been carrying in prayer all our confreres and communities in different parts of the world. For us Salesians it is a hollowed place where Don Bosco experienced the maternal presence and

accompaniment of Mary, Help of Christians. The Chapter members will certainly “take home” (cf. John 19:27) Our Blessed Mother to continue our journey to follow Jesus and “do what he tells us” (John 2:5). The Holy Spirit has been accompanying us in our deliberations, and we need the strength and the power of the Spirit to continue to live our charismatic identity in fidelity to the Risen Lord.

THE NEW RECTOR MAJOR AND THE NEW GENERAL COUNCILORS


The 29th General Chapter of the Salesians of Don Bosco has elected Father Fabio Attard as our 11th Rector Major. Father Attard, a Maltese Salesian, with extensive theological, pastoral, and academic experience, embodies Don Bosco’s charisma and is poised to lead our Salesian mission globally. As the Rector Major, he will guide the congregation’s 13,750 consecrated Salesians in 92 provinces across 136 nations.

Born in Gozo, Malta, Father Attard has a degree in Theology from UPS and a Licentiate in Moral Theology from Accademia Alfonsiana, Rome and a doctorate from Milltown Institute of Theology and Philosophy, Ireland. Father Attard has held various leadership roles, including General Councillor for Youth Ministry for two terms, and has promoted global initiatives addressing issues like marginalization, poverty, and migration.

His contribution to the universal Church was recognized by Pope Francis, who appointed him as a Consultant to the Dicastery for Laity, Family, and Life. He also strengthened missionary volunteer programmes and consolidated technical and vocational education and training through initiatives like Don Bosco Tech Africa and Don Bosco Tech ASEAN, representing the Salesians at important international forums on youth policy, migration, and youth employment in Brussels and New York.

From 2020 to 2023, Father Attard coordinated Salesian and Lay Formation in Europe through a project which led to the creation of a master’s programme for the formation of Salesians and lay collaborators, now managed by the Pontifical Salesian University in collaboration with the Youth Ministry Sector.

The Salesian congregation and its 32 member Salesian Family groups worldwide welcome Father Attard as their new leader, entrusting him with the mission of animating and governing them in the 21st century.

FR. STEFANO MARTOGLIO - VICAR OF THE RECTOR MAJOR

The 29th General Chapter of our congregation has re-elected Fr. Stefano Martoglio as Vicar of the Rector Major, a role he has held since 2020.

Born in Turin, Italy, on November 30, 1965, he joined the Salesians in 1984, made perpetual vows in 1992, and was ordained in 1994. He served as Rector of Valdocco, Superior of the Piedmont and Valle d'Aosta Circumscription, and Regional Councillor for the Mediterranean Region.



First elected Vicar in 2020, he led the Congregation from August 2024 following the appointment of Cardinal Ángel Fernández Artime. His renewed mandate ensures continuity in guiding Salesian governance and religious life.

FR. SILVIO ROGGIA - GENERAL COUNCILLOR FOR FORMATION

The GC 29 has elected Fr. Silvio Roggia as the new General Councillor for Formation.

Born on July 4, 1963, in Novello, Italy, he joined the Salesians in 1982, made perpetual vows in 1989, and dedicated nearly 20 years to missionary work in West Africa, serving as Novice Master in Nigeria and Ghana. He later became Provincial Delegate for Formation and Vicar of the AFW Province.

Since 2016, he has contributed to Salesian formation globally, leading an international study on initial formation and accompaniment. Most recently, he served as Rector of the “Zeffirino Namuncurá” community in Rome. His expertise will now guide the ongoing formation of Salesians worldwide.

FR. RAFAEL BEJARANO - GENERAL COUNCILLOR FOR YOUTH MINISTRY

The GC 29 has elected Fr. Rafael Bejarano as the new General Councillor for Youth Ministry.

Born on December 1, 1977, in Buga, Colombia, he joined the Salesians in 1996, made his perpetual vows in 2003, and was ordained in 2006. He holds a master's degree in Social Enterprise Administration and is pursuing a Ph.D. in International Cooperation for Development.

Fr. Bejarano has served as Youth Ministry Delegate, Provincial Councillor, and Rector of “Ciudad Don Bosco” in Medellín. Since 2020, he has worked in the Youth Ministry Sector at the Salesian Generalate in Rome, focusing on social works and services. His experience will now guide Salesian youth ministry worldwide.

FR. FIDEL MARIA ORENDAIN - GENERAL COUNCILLOR FOR SOCIAL COMMUNICATION

The GC 29 has elected Fr. Fidel Maria Orendain as the new General Councillor for Social Communication. He previously served as Provincial of the Southern Philippines (FIS) Province.

Born on April 24, 1965, in Manila, Philippines, Fr. Orendain entered the Salesians in 1984, made his perpetual vows in 1993, and was ordained the same year. He holds a Master's in Communication from Georgetown University and a Doctorate from the University of the Philippines.

With over 20 years in Social Communication, he has served as Rector, President, and Academic Dean at Don Bosco institutions, as well as Regional Coordinator for 124 Catholic schools in the Visayas. His leadership and expertise will now guide Salesian communication initiatives worldwide.

FR. JORGE MARIO CRISAFULLI - GENERAL COUNCILLOR FOR THE MISSIONS

The GC29 has elected Fr. Jorge Mario Crisafulli as the new General Councillor for the Missions. Previously, he served as Provincial Superior of the Africa Nigeria-Niger Province (ANN).

Born on March 19, 1961, in Bahía Blanca, Argentina, Fr. Crisafulli joined the Salesians in 1980, made his perpetual vows in 1986, and was ordained a priest in 1990. A missionary in West Africa since 1996, he held key leadership roles, including Rector, Provincial Superior of AFW, and Director of Don Bosco Fambul in Sierra Leone, where he expanded social outreach for street children.

As the first Provincial of the Nigeria-Niger Province (2022-2025), he strengthened Salesian missions. Fluent in Spanish, English, and Italian, he now brings his vast missionary experience to guide and promote Salesian evangelization worldwide.

FR. GABRIEL STAWOWY - ECONOMER GENERAL

The GC 29 has elected Fr. Gabriel Stawowy from Poland as the new Economer General. Born on December 25, 1966, in Miedźna, Poland, Fr. Stawowy entered the Salesians in 1984, making his first profession in 1985, perpetual vows in 1991, and was ordained a priest in 1995.

He has held key leadership roles, including Rector, School Principal, Provincial Councillor, and Province Economer in the Kraków Province (PLS). He also served at the Salesian Missions in New Rochelle, USA.

With studies at the Salesian Pontifical University in Rome and Berkeley, USA, and fluency in Polish, Italian, and English, he brings extensive financial and administrative expertise to his new role, ensuring responsible stewardship of Salesian resources worldwide.

VOCATION CAMPS HELD AT JORAPARA AND SIRAJULI

The Vocation Camps for Post Matric boys were conducted at Jorapara (Mendal) and Sirajuli from 24th to 27th March 2025. YOUTH LEADERS GATHER FOR ANIMATION AND PLANNING AT DBI

Around sixty youth leaders from twenty-six Salesian presences of our Province participated in a one-day animation and planning session at Don Bosco Institute, Kharghuli, on March 22, 2025. The meeting began with a prayer led by Sr. Athisa FMA, setting a reflective tone for the day.

CONSULTATION ON THE WELFARE OF ASSAM'S MIGRANT WORKERS

On March 20, 2025, Don Bosco Institute, Kharghuli, hosted a one-day consultation titled “Collaborative Action for Assam Migrants: A Stakeholder Dialogue,” bringing together key stakeholders to address the challenges faced by Assam’s migrant workers in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Goa, Gujarat, and Delhi.

Fr. Ignatius Gari, Associate Director of Bosco Reach Out, welcomed and felicitated the participants, while Fr. Francis Bosco, In-Charge of South Asia



Migrant Ministry, provided an analysis of migration trends. Chief Guest Shri Kanpai Das, Deputy Labour Commissioner of Assam, emphasized the need for stronger support systems for migrant workers. Discussions were led by Fr. Albert Thyrniang, Director of the Migrant Help Desk, Satgaon, and Mr. Louis Aind, retd. DIG, Assam Police of Assam, expressed gratitude to the attendees.




