Greetings from Don Bosco Provincial House, Guwahati!

ADIEU TO POPE FRANCIS

We have witnessed an extraordinary moment of grief and solidarity in mourning the passing away of our beloved Holy Father, Pope Francis and in paying tribute to his legacy. We as Salesians share Don Bosco's deep sense of fidelity to the Pope. His autobiography "Hope" reveals many anecdotes describing his close relationship with the Salesians. As we pray for Pope Francis let us try to emulate his example of fidelity to the gospel, love for the poor, his openness to embrace diversity, his compassion for those who are on the margins, his concern for the environment and so many other values that became his hallmark. As Pope Francis leaves behind a rich legacy, let us try to inculcate these values in our communities, in the young people in our pastoral care, and the people we minister to in our parishes and centres. Let us continue to pray for the Church as the Cardinals discern the will of God in electing a successor to lead the Catholic Church.

THE CLOSING OF THE GC 29

As the GC 29 came to a close the Chapter members dispersed to their respective countries and provinces. I am happy to be back in the Province after more than two months of absence. I wish to thank Fr Bivan Mukhim, our Vice Provincial, for taking on many of the responsibilities of the ordinary administration of the Province. Together with Fr Jayaprakash, our Economist, he was able to facilitate the transfers and installations of confreres in our various communities. I thank you for your cooperation in ensuring the smooth transitions and taking on new responsibilities in the communities to which you have been assigned. I also take this opportunity to thank you for your prayers for me and the two delegates of our Province who attended the GC 29. We too have prayed for you, our communities and various apostolates in the Province during the time we spent in Valdocco, the cradle of Don Bosco's apostolate and of Salesian spirituality.

THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

Let us continue to pray for Rev Fr Fabio Attard, our Rector Major and the 11th successor of Don Bosco and the Council elected by the GC29. We also wish Fr Biju Michael for his second term as Regional of South Asia. In the months to come we shall get the documents of the GC29 which will offer us much food for reflection and study. Let us continue our efforts to follow the Lord in fidelity to the charism of Don Bosco, the sure path to holiness.

THE MYSTERY OF EASTER AND THE WORK OF THE SPIRIT

We are in the Easter Season. May this season of grace become important moments in our spiritual journey so that we come closer to the Risen Lord, become more keenly aware of the working of the Holy Spirit in the lives of people and institutions. The testimony of the Acts of the Apostles unfolds before us how the Church grew in numbers and strength under the power of the Risen Lord. The mystery of Easter continues to unfold in our own times and God is at work in and through us, calling us to become instruments of his grace and mercy. Let us be always led by the Spirit and live in the awareness of the Lord's abiding presence among us.

DON BOSCO AND THE MONTH OF MARY

The month of May is traditionally observed as the month of Mary. We have inherited a rich legacy of Marian devotion from our Father and Founder Don Bosco. He wrote many books, treatises, prayers to promote devotion to Mary. But the first important Marian book of Don Bosco is called *Month of May in Honour of Mary Immaculate* published in 1858. It was published in the Catholic Readings as a booklet of 192 pages and went through many editions. It was written to serve as an aid to honour Mary and to do homage to the Immaculate Conception. This book is less about Mary than it is about the Christian life. Don Bosco conceived all devotion, whether to Christ, Mary, or the Saints, as an application of the saying of Jesus, "If you love me keep my commandments," with no sentimentality.

DON BOSCO AND THE MANY TITLES OF MARY

From a young age Don Bosco was familiar with the many titles under which Mary was honoured. These titles had a decisive impact on his life, not only as a formative element of spirituality, but also as a guide and a force for his vocational decisions and his apostolate.

Our Lady of the Castle was her title at Castelnuovo, *Our Lady of Graces* was the title of the Madonna whose image stood above one of the altars of the "cathedral" at Chieri. *Our Lady of Consolation*, the *Consolata*, was the favourite of the people of Turin. Don Bosco honoured *Our Lady of the Rosary*, a popular title since time immemorial, by dedicating a chapel in his brother Joseph's house at Becchi. He wrote a devotional pamphlet in honour of *Our Lady of Sorrows* when he was chaplain in the institutions of the Marchioness Barolo. She was also referred to as the *Our Lady*, or the *Madonna* and the *Immaculate Conception*. In the *Companion of Youth*, the book of devotion that Don Bosco wrote for young people, he encouraged devotion to Mary under various titles. But the title he adopted and popularised for the Salesian family and apostolate was *Mary Help of Christians*.

THE GOAL OF MARIAN DEVOTION

Mary was a living and guiding presence throughout Don Bosco's whole life, and he firmly believed in her presence and maternal guidance. Her presence in his life was not just an abstract belief but a daily reality. He developed a filial and personal relationship with Mary, and he expressed his devotion by continuous prayer and dedication to his work and mission. In moments of

joys and trials alike, Don Bosco turned to the Madonna as his guide, protector, and source of encouragement. He favoured the cultic expression of devotion to Mary, through the celebration of the traditional liturgical feasts in her honour, making them instruments for growth in the Christian life for himself and his boys.

Don Bosco welcomed and encouraged traditional devotions, popular devotions too, provided they were theologically sound and spiritually profitable. His Marian prayer was also rooted in the liturgy and the tradition of the Church. The *Hail Mary*, the *Angelus* and the *Regina Caeli*, the seasonal anthems (*Salve Regina*, *Ave Regina Caelorum*, *Salve Redemptoris Mater*), the Rosary, the Litany, and obviously, short prayers of all kinds, formed the staples of his Marian piety. He could not conceive of devotion to Mary, no matter what its form, apart from an effort to imitate her virtues, especially her faith, love and purity, and a better Christian life. This ethical-pastoral approach to the Marian devotion took absolute precedence in the spirituality of Don Bosco.

MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS

The title of Mary Help of Christians, *Auxilium Christianorum*, was not so frequently used by Don Bosco in the early years of his life or apostolate. However, the title was already added by St. Pius V to the Litany after a victory won by Christian forces against the Turks through Mary's intercession in the year 1771. In 1815 Pius VII instituted the feast of Mary Help of Christians in order to express his gratitude to Mary, the great Queen of Heaven, for his restoration to the Roman See and for the restoration of peace to the Church, which he attributed to Mary's intercession. May 24 was designated as the date for this feast.

In the 1860s onwards the title assumed more importance, thanks to a series of events in Italy and in the Church. It was from 1862 onwards that we find Don Bosco using the title "Help of Christians" more frequently and intentionally. The revolution culminating in the takeover of the Papal States and the unification of Italy gave currency to the title "Help of Christians" and conferred on it an even greater political charge. The apparition and miracle of Our Lady at Spoleto in 1862 also contributed to this development. Spoleto was at the centre of Italy, and the miracles there fired the imagination of the people. Archbishop Arnaldi of Spoleto believed that Mary, the Help of Christians, was giving a pledge of the coming triumph of the Church and of the Pope. In 1864-1865 he built a shrine dedicated to Mary, Help of Christians on the site of the miracle, as a citadel from which Mary would defend the Church.

THE BASILICA OF MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS: DON BOSCO'S MONUMENT TO MARY

In December 1862 Don Bosco began to speak of his own plan to build a great church dedicated to Mary Help of Christians. He first confided his plan to Seminarian Paul Albera and to Father John Cagliero. He said to Cagliero: "The Madonna wishes us to honour her under the title of Help of Christians. The times are so bad that we sorely need her help for the preservation and defence of the Christian faith."

Soon he set out to solicit financial help toward the project. Since the title "Help of Christians" to which the Spoleto events gave currency was closely related to the current political situation, he knew it would be controversial. Hence, when he began to solicit permissions and funds for the new church, he was fairly reticent about the title. But in his circular addressed to benefactors he stated that the Church would be dedicated to Mary Immaculate under the title Mary Help of Christians.

In his *Memoirs of the Oratory*, Don Bosco related the dream he had in 1844, and the Shepherdess leading him to a field under cultivation. There he saw a great church rising before him and, inside the church, the inscription, *Hic domus mea, inde gloria mea* ("Here is my house, from here goes forth my glory.") The church of Mary Help of Christians stood as an act of faith and courage on Don Bosco's part. Really and symbolically, it stood as the centre of a work and a movement that could no longer be stopped. From this church Don Bosco's apostolate would radiate to all parts of the world. The Church of Mary Help of Christians continues to be the symbol of his great legacy for the Salesians to this day.

OTHER MONUMENTS TO MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS

Don Bosco left behind a wealth of written resources- books, prayers, hymns blessings. The Blessing of Mary Help of Christians composed by him was approved by the Church with indulgences in 1878. He made the early Salesians too to contribute to this large corpus. In 1872 he co-founded the Institute of the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (Salesian Sisters) with Mary Dominica Mazzarello. He started the Work of Mary Help of Christians for Adult Vocations (Sons of Mary) in 1875, and the Association of the Devotees of Mary Help of Christians in 1869.

Over the years many more Congregations with the title of Mary were born and became part of the Salesian Family. In our region we have the Missionary Sisters of Mary Help of Christians (MSMHC), the Sisters of Mary Immaculate (SMI), and the Visitation Sisters of Don Bosco (VSDB). The Salesian pioneers who came to our region experienced the presence of Mary Help of Christians on their arrival. She has accompanied the missionary apostolate in our region and devotion to Mary has continued to be so much a part of the life and mission of our own region and the Province. The pioneers also chose Mary Help of Christians as the patron of our Province.

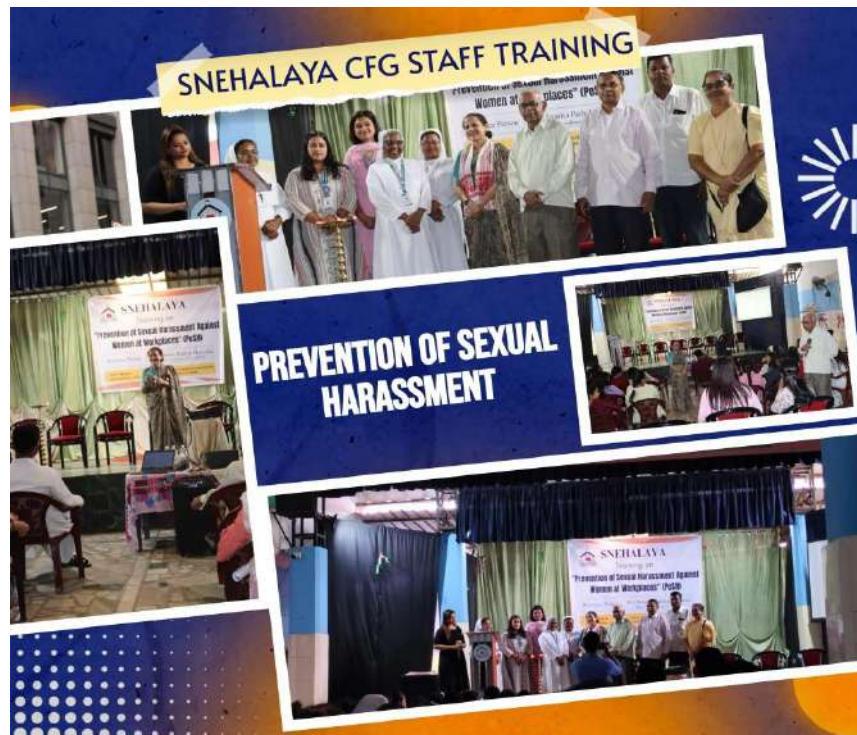
TRAINING ON PREVENTION OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT CONDUCTED FOR CFG STAFF.

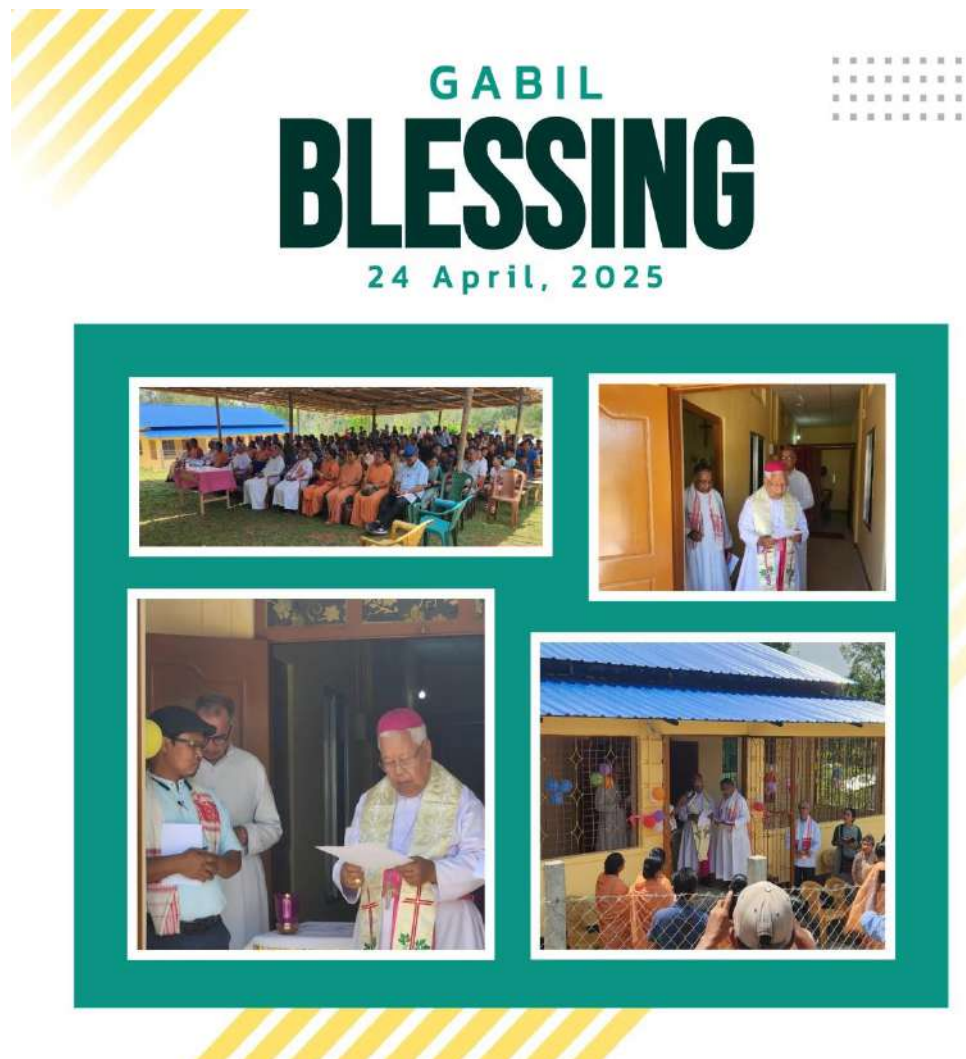

YOUTH PASCH 2025 AT DBI

Don Bosco Institute, Kharghuli, came alive with faith and fervour as it hosted *Youth Pasch 2025* from 17th to 20th April under the theme “*Journeying with Jesus.*” Around 700 youth from across the region gathered to experience the Easter Triduum through well prepare and well animated liturgies, prayer services, guided meditations, singing, drama, Maundy Thursday Service, creative enactment of the last Supper, Easter Cantata on Good Friday and enactment of the way of the cross etc.



The celebration began with Palm Sunday on 13th April, led by Fr. Cletus Sebastian SDB, Rector and Executive Director of DBI. Highlights included sessions by Fr. John Barman MSFS, praise and worship led by Mr. Ravi Hembrom and Ms. Priya Hansepi, and a moving re-enactment of the Last Supper. 

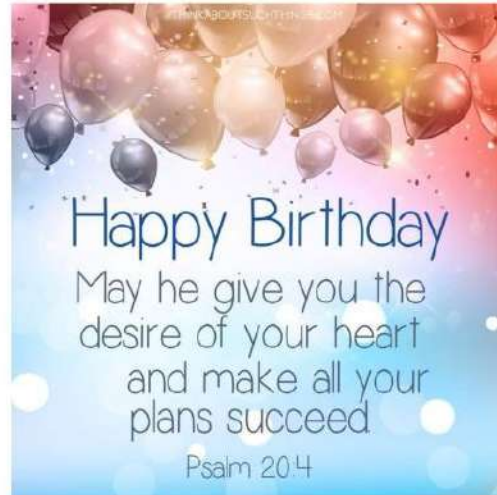
