#### STAFF TRAINNING

On April 4, 2025, Snehalaya Child Friendly Guwahati (CFG) held a POSH training at Snehalaya Paltanbazar, empowering 90 participants including staff, coordinators, and adolescents. Conducted by Ma'am Anurita Pathak Hazarika (NEN Assam), the session fostered awareness on gender sensitivity, consent, empathy, and safe workplaces.





Key learnings included understanding legal protections, the role of the Internal Committee, and fostering respect and accountability. Reallife case discussions and expert inputs by psychologist Ms. Binita Sharma deepened insights, while adolescent involvement encouraged early awareness. The program concluded with a collective pledge to uphold dianity, equality, and a harassment-free environment at Snehalaya.

#### RONGALI BIHU CELEBRATION

On 12th April 2025, Child Friendly Guwahati joyfully celebrated Rongali Bihu across all CFG Centres, filling the air with music, dance, and community spirit. The festivities began with warm welcome speeches by social educators, followed by melodious Bihu songs and lively Bihu dances performed by both children and educators. 

Session 1 on Family-Based Alternative Care was conducted by Anamika Das, while Session 2 on Mission Vatsalya was led by Padmini Saikia and





Alokita Barua. Special guests included Tarali Das, The Additional Member Secretary, SCPS, Father Provincial Fr. Sebastian Mathew, Fr. Lukose Cheruvalel, and Fr. Sebastian Kunnathukuzhy. At this occasion, the Snehalaya Annual Report was formally released by our distinguished guests. The celebration featured the felicitation of CFG and Snehalaya HSLC 2025 achievers, the relaunch of EKTA Juvenile Justice Network, and the announcement of a research study by Assam Bosco University on the impact of deinstitutionalization in Kamrup (M) concluding with a warm, shared meal together.

The following day at the CFG office, Fr. Sebastian delivered the welcome address, followed by Fr. Lukose, Director of Snehalaya, who shared the inspiring history of Snehalaya and CFG's evolving vision with a PPT presentation. Presentations by Jharna, Rescue Coordinator, and Himakshi, Project Secretary, showcased impressive rescue efforts, innovative initiatives, and resource mobilisation, giving Miss Smita a vibrant and comprehensive understanding of CFG's impactful work.

On 5th June 2025, Child Friendly Guwahati (CFG) turned green and happy to celebrate World Environment Day! Across all CFG centres, inspiring children and community members to protect and nurture our planet. Children drew colourful pictures of nature, made eco-friendly paper bags, and planted 32 little saplings—each one a new friend for the Earth. Social educators shared exciting stories about why trees, clean air, and a plastic-free world matter. With juicy mango treats and big smiles, everyone promised to care for our planet every day, making "Go Green" not just a slogan, but a way of life!



## World Day Against Child Labour

World Day Against Child Labour was observed on June 2025, Snehalaya Child Guwahati, in collaboration with government officials, observed World Day Against Child Labour at Don Mario Hall, Panbazar. The event, themed on celebrating rescued children and raising awareness, was graced by dignitaries including (District Mrs. **Parijat** Bhuyan Development Commissioner), Mr. Hemanta Kalita (Assistant Labour Commissioner), Rev. Bivan Mukhim (Vice Provincial, Don Bosco Provincial House), Father Lukose Cheruvalel (Director, Snehalaya), Shehnaz Khan & Mr. Pravesh Chandra Das (Legal Aid Defence Counsels), and Ms. Tanima Dhar (District Child Protection Unit).





Inspirational speeches and addressed poverty, education gaps, and welfare schemes like Viksit Bharat. Cultural highlights included a dance by Jyoti Snehalaya girls, a musical skit by CFG Sijubari children, and a song by Ms. Leena Kalita (Panjabari Centre). Three rescued children received backwage compensation (₹1.5 lakh, ₹90,000, ₹60,000). A street rally and play with police, railway officials, and Don Bosco students further spread awareness, urging citizens to call Childline 1098 to report exploitation.



### **International Yoga Day**

On 21st June, 2025 CFG celebrated International Yoga Day 2025 across all 33 Child Friendly Guwahati (CFG) centres, inspiring children and community members to embrace a healthier lifestyle. Social educators introduced simple yoga asanas and breathing techniques, fostering awareness of physical fitness, mental calmness, and self-discipline. In some centres, children confidently led the sessions, encouraging peer learning and leadership. The celebration nurtured a spirit of togetherness, boosted confidence, and motivated participants to make yoga a joyful part of their daily lives.



## COMMUNITY AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

In June and July 2025, Child Friendly Guwahati (CFG) conducted 29 Community Awareness Campaigns on *Child Rights, Child Protection Issues and Reporting Mechanism* across 31 areas of Guwahati, Kamrup Metro, led by Child Protection Officer Musabbir Hussain with cluster coordinators. An ample number of community members actively participated, making the initiative a vibrant and





engaging platform. The sessions proved to be an eye-opener for many, as participants became more aware of their rights, gained valuable knowledge on child protection laws, and learned how to access vital services and identity documents. Through rallies, public discussions, and Q&A sessions, the campaign inspired collective action towards building safer, more nurturing communities for children. Over 1440 community members participated in the awareness sessions conducted in 31 CFG centres.



#### **Rescue Department**

From April to June, the Child Friendly Guwahati (CFG) Rescue Team, led by Coordinator Jharna Chakraborty with officers Raju Mahanta and Jay Das, in collaboration with the District Task Force (DTF) and local authorities, successfully rescued 19 children from child labour across Guwahati. This included a 10-year-old girl engaged in domestic work and 18 boys (aged 14-17) employed in bike garages, welding shops, restaurants, car washes, hotels, and butcher shops. After rescue, the children were produced before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and safely reunited with their families, after the parents gave an undertaking that they will not engage them in child labour reaffirming CFG's commitment to child rights and protection.

This 38th Edition of Sneha Dhwoni (Echoes of Love) brings you a brief account of all the loving activities that were carried out in the 5 Snehalaya Homes and the 33 Child Friendly Guwahati (CFG) centres from April to June 2025. The 125 children in the Homes receive 24x7 A to Z loving care, whereas the 2000 children in the CFG centres get motivational as well as after-school loving support aimed at dropout prevention. The diverse and engaging activities guided by the team of over 90 staff members, numerous volunteers and interns and a core team of 10 spiritually driven child-friendly persons gradually help Snehalaya to move a little closer to its vision of creating a Child Friendly City where there is a safety net for children and a culture of child safeguarding.
